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**Scope and Content / Abstract:**

The collection documents activities at the Sedalia Post Office from about 1914 to 1917. Most of the materials in the collection relate to change of address forms or money orders. Since there was no bank in Sedalia, most transaction which today would be processed using a check were handled by money order.

The collection is composed of two bound volumes (the binding on one is broken) and one binder. The books, mostly money orders or materials, relating to change of address. The books have been microfilmed, three copies are available.
